WEETON & DISTRICT AGRICULTURAL & HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY GENERAL RULES 2024

- 1 The sole object of this Society is for the benefit of the Community and the improvement of Agriculture, Horticulture and livestock breeding and all proceeds are to be devoted to these objectives.
- 2 All exhibits, except in the case of any open classes which may be arranged, shall be the work or product of the Exhibitor resident, or in the case of children's' classes those also attending a primary school, within the Show district. The show district comprises an area 5 miles radius of the Showground and includes the parishes of Harewood, Kearby, Arthington, Kirkby Overblow, Pannal, Beckwithshaw, Stainburn, Leathley, Pool, Eccup, Bramhope, Burn Bridge, North Rigton, Sicklinghall, Follifoot and Dunkeswick.
- 3 Postal or online entries will only be accepted if accompanied by the correct entry fees. Postal enquiries will require a self-addressed stamped envelope.
- 4 Entry fees will not normally be refunded unless the circumstances are considered exceptional.
- 5 All exhibits to be the property of the Exhibitor on the date of entry published in this schedule. The Society reserves the right to publish the results by any means available, including the use of photography.
- 6 All exhibits, except those allocated to special times must be staged not later than 10.00am on the day of the Show.
- 7 The organisers accept no liability whatsoever for any damage to any exhibits.
- 8 The Society will not be responsible for incorrect classification of exhibits staged on or before the day of the Show.
- 9 No exhibit shall be removed from the Show before the conclusion of the presentation of prizes, but it shall then be removed by the Exhibitor within the time announced by the Committee, all exhibits not cleared away within such time shall become the property of the Society for disposal.
- 10 If in any livestock class there are less than four entries, then the third prize in that class may be withheld at the discretion of the judge.
- 11 Exhibitors are allowed more than one entry in any single class.
- 12 To determine the "bona fide" of an Exhibitor, the Executive Committee is empowered to appoint a Sub Committee to inspect the garden or land of such exhibitor either prior or subsequent to the Show.
- 13 No exhibitor shall be allowed within the Show marquee during the time of judging.
- 14 The judges shall be empowered to withhold the awards of any or all the prizes in any class, if in their opinion, the exhibits in that class do not attain a sufficiently high standard of merit.
- 15 Any objection by any exhibitor relating to any exhibit or exhibits must be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary before 3.00 pm on the day of the Show and be accompanied by a deposit of ± 10.00 which will be refunded should any objection be sustained or adjudged to be based on reasonable grounds. All disputes shall be investigated by the Committee and its decision shall be final and binding.
- 16 For distinguishing the professional from the amateur gardener for competition in the Sections for Flowers and Vegetables, anyone who by garden labour or the sale of garden produce makes their livelihood shall be deemed a professional and shall only be entitled to enter in the professional class; and anyone who employs a fulltime professional gardener shall also be restricted to that class.
- 17 Any Exhibitor infringing these rules shall forfeit their entrance fees and any prize money which may have been awarded to them.
- 18 Each Trophy shall be held for one year under a guarantee that it will be delivered to the Trophy Secretary, 5 weeks before the Show in good condition with new engraving completed and that in the event of its loss or damage the

appropriate amount of its value or repair to be made good to the Secretary by the holder. ID will be required for the trophy winner prior to collection.

- 19 Competitors in all sections should read the rules specific to that section, which appear at the beginning of those classes.
- 20 Any person making a false entry or otherwise infringing any of the rules, regulations or conditions of the Society may be prohibited from exhibiting or competing at any future shows.
- 21 Any persons under the age of 16 must be supervised.

Weeton Show is not responsible for any damage to property or injury to persons arising out of any activity carried out on the Showground prior to, during, or after the day of the Show. Any person entering or bringing any property onto the showground does so entirely at his or her own risk. The Society will not accept responsibility for any claim for damage or injury caused in any way whatsoever on the showground on the day of the Show. In line with Health and Safety regulations, no horse drawn vehicles or horses are allowed on the show fields unless they are competing or part of a prearranged display. Exhibitors are reminded that it is their responsibility to insure against damage caused by their animals. The Society will not be responsible for incorrect classification of exhibits staged on or before the day of the Show.

RULES FOR <u>ALL</u> HORSE AND PONY CLASSES

PLEASE READ AND KEEP

- 1 Closing date for on-line and postal entries strictly <u>SUNDAY 30 JUNE 2024</u>. WE REGRET, <u>NO</u> ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THIS DATE. <u>ONLY</u> CLEAR ROUND AND CHILDREN'S FANCY DRESS ENTRIES CAN BE MADE ON THE DAY WITH AN ADDITIONAL SURCHARGE
- 2 Entries of £10 (excluding medical fee) will entitle the competitor to one gate entry ticket and one-horse vehicle pass; entries £20 and over (excluding medical fee) will entitle the competitor to a maximum of two gate entry tickets and one-horse vehicle pass. Anyone without a gate entry ticket will be charged for entry to the showground.
- 3 Please ensure you have read the General Society Rules. Further information is available on the website www.weetonshow.co.uk
- 4 No postal entries accepted unless accompanied by correct entry fees and large first class stamped addressed A5 or larger envelope for returning numbers.
- 5 Competitor numbers must be worn at all times when mounted on the showground.
- 6 Following a fall in the ring, the horse and ride must both leave the ring and take no further part in that class.
- 7 Protective Clothing It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that a correctly secured hat that meets the current safety standards is worn when riding on the showground or exercise areas. We strongly recommend the wearing of body protectors in all classes.
- 8 There is a compulsory payment of £2.00 for each competitor (exc. Community pony classes) to cover the provision of medical services.
- 9 All Equestrian activities present a high and inherent risk to both participants and bystanders. Neither the landowners or organisers of Weeton Show accept any responsibility whatsoever for any accident, injury, loss, damage or death to any person, animal or property. It is your responsibility to be suitably and adequately insured with £3 million public liability insurance recommended as a minimum. Entry or attendance to Weeton Show is done so at your own risk.
- 10 No lunging allowed anywhere on show ground, warm up in horse designated areas only please remember many of the spectators are not used to horses.
- 11 All stallions or colts, of 3 years or over, must wear a bit or chifney at ALL times whilst on the show ground and must not be handled by any person under the age

of 16 years. Stallions must have a white ribbon in their tail or a stallion disc displayed on their bridle.

- 12 In all classes, the judge's decision is final. Objections must be made in writing to the General Secretary with a deposit of £10. See Society Rule 15.
- 13 Cups and trophies remain the property of the Committee and are to be returned to the Trophy Secretary at least 5 weeks before the next show. To collect a trophy, the relevant slip needs providing. See Society Rule 18.
- 14 The Society will not be responsible for incorrect classification of exhibits. Please declare eligibility for specific special prizes on entry form.
- 15 Horse competitors should kindly note access will not be granted to any part of the showground (with or without horses) until 7am on Show Day. Access will be permitted only upon production of gate ticket and relevant vehicle pass. Passes are strictly non-transferable. Competitor numbers must also be clearly displayed at all times. Any contravention of these rules will result in admission refused and entries being cancelled without refund.
- 16 Please have your ticket with you at all times. It is a condition of horse and livestock entry that Exhibitors accept the number of passes allocated and agree to pay admission charges on entering the Show Field for all other persons accompanying them.
- 17 In the event of three (3) or less exhibitors in any Class, then the Society reserves the right to either cancel that Class or amalgamate with another Class or Classes. The judge has complete discretion to move immediately on to the next class or wait for a short period of time in between classes.
- 18 The substitution or swapping of entries before or after the closing date will not be permitted, and no refunds will be given.
- 19 As per the Equine Identification (England) Regulations 2018, it is now a legal requirement that all horses, ponies and donkeys are microchipped.
- 20 All exhibitors must ensure that when not partaking in a competition or parade, they confine their horses to the horse walks and horsebox parking area.
- 21 Prize money and appearance money <u>must be collected from the Horse Secretary</u> by 4pm on the Show Day or it will be forfeited. Prize money will <u>NOT</u> be posted or given after the event.
- 22 Incorrect or excessive use of whips or canes will not be tolerated and will lead to disqualification of all classes and will possibly affect future entries. No galloping is allowed on the showground.
- 23 In the interests of equine welfare, we request all riders to be of suitable size and weight for their horse or pony. Any deemed to be in excess may be disqualified.
- 24 The Society reserves the right to merge, split or limit class sizes if necessary.
- 25 Competitors cannot enter and compete in a class where the judge has had a financial interest in that equine, or any other equine belonging to the competitor. This includes producing, riding, schooling, instructing, livery, selling, buying, breeding etc.

HELPFUL NOTES FOR COMPETITORS

DRESS AND TURNOUT FOR RIDDEN SHOWING CLASSES HORSE

a) No tack may be worn which in any way conceals an animal's conformation.

b) No rugs, clothing or item of tack that reveals the identity of a horse or owner may be worn in the show ring.

c) Martingales are only to be used on Working Hunters

d) The complete bridle must be plain leather.

e) Swales, Sam Marsh bits and Gags with double bridles are actively discouraged. Bitless bridles are not allowed. Four- and five-year-olds should be ridden in snaffle bridles.

f) Lead rein ponies are to be led by a competent attendant aged 16 or over and shown in a snaffle bridle. Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

RIDER

g) Anyone on a horse must wear a skull cap or hat and safety harness according to the current approved European / BSI safety standard when mounted. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover.

h) Riders must wear an appropriate jacket with a shirt and tie, tweed coat for men. Tweed coat or plain blue or black coat for women.

i) Plain fawn or buff-coloured breeches, not white except for show jumping.

j) Plain black or brown boots, garter straps optional

k) Spurs or spur bands are <u>not</u> permitted under any circumstance.

I) Any form of leather or string glove are acceptable.

m) No earrings or visible jewellery should be worn.

n) It is the responsibility of exhibitors to ensure that grooms entering the Show Ring are smartly and professionally turned out.

o) The wearing of body protectors is encouraged.

p) In hand competitors should not have whips longer than 36" and ridden competitor's whips should not exceed 24" to 30".

5. THE WINNING ANIMAL MUST BE REGISTERED OR ELIGIBLE FOR REGISTRATION IN THE STUD BOOK OR GRADE B REGISTER.

6. The Judge invited to officiate must be on the Society's Official Panel and has the right to withhold the award of the Silver Spoon and Rosette if an exhibit does not show sufficient merit.

7. The Council reserves the right in offering Spoons, to award them only to persons approved by the Shire Horse Society


