- 2. Closing date for entries 14th July 2024.
- 3. In exceptional circumstances, late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Secretary subject to an additional penalty charge of 20p per exhibit.
- 4. No entries on the day.
- 5. Entries of £9 or more from an individual adult exhibitor will entitle the exhibitor to one complimentary exhibitor admission ticket. Entries of £6 or more from an individual child exhibitor will entitle the exhibitor to one complimentary exhibitor admission ticket. Posting of exhibitor tickets cannot be guaranteed for late entries.
- 6. All exhibits must be staged by **10.00 am.** Exhibits may be removed no earlier than **4.30 pm.**
- 7. In 2024, all classes are defined as Open Classes.
- 8. Prize money will be paid from **3.30pm** onwards from the Produce Tent. Trophy winners will be asked for proof of identity when collecting trophies.
- 9. Each Trophy shall be held for one year under a guarantee that it will be delivered to the Trophy Secretary, 5 weeks before the Show in good condition, new engraving completed and that in the event of its loss or damage the appropriate amount of its value or repair to be made good to the Secretary by the holder.
- 10. All work must be the original work or produce of the exhibitor, and not have been shown at Weeton Show previously.
- 11. Exhibitors should ensure that garments/exhibits are clean and unworn.
- 12. When allocating trophies for most points gained, points will be awarded as follows: 1st place- 3 points; 2nd place- 2 points; 3rd place- 1 point.

Suggested Recipe for Limoncello

5 unwaxed lemons

1 litre bottle of vodka

750g caster sugar

700ml boiling water

- * Pare the zest from all the lemons, taking care not to include any white pith. Put the zest in a large clean jar and pour over the vodka. Cover with a tightly fitting lid and leave for a week, shaking the jar each day.
- * Put the sugar in a heatproof bowl and pour over the boiling water, stirring until the sugar has dissolved. Add the vodka and peels and leave for a further week, shaking the jar regularly.
- * Strain into decorative bottles, adding a few strips of lemon zest to each bottle.

P17 Honey Date and Walnut Cake

(NB please label whether made with shop bought / your own honey).

Ingredients: 225g self-raising flour; $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp ground cinnamon; 175g softened butter; 100g light muscovado sugar; 3 tbs clear honey; 2 eggs beaten; 2 med sized ripe bananas; 100g stoned dates; 50g walnut pieces

Pre-heat oven to 160°C

Grease and line a 2lb loaf tin with greaseproof paper.

Tip flour, cinnamon, butter, sugar and 2 tbs honey into a large bowl. Mash bananas and chop dates (scissors are best for this) and add to bowl. Beat for 2-3 minutes until well blended.

Spoon into prepared tin, scatter the top with walnuts, bake for 1 hour.

Test to check whether cake is cooked using a dry skewer.

Turn out onto a wire rack, when cold drizzle remaining honey over cake.

- P19 HANDMADE MULTIGRAIN COB using 450g (1lb) of flour
- P20 4 SOURDOUGH HOT CROSS BUNS

Ingredients 300g active sourdough starter (suggested recipe: Sourdough starter recipe | BBC Good Food); 2 large eggs, beaten; 200ml milk; 500g strong white bread flour, plus extra for dusting; 60g golden caster sugar; 1 tsp ground cinnamon; 1 tsp mixed spice; 1 orange, zested; 150g raisins, or a mixture of small dried fruits (such as raisins, mixed peel and cranberries): 100g unsalted butter, softened

Step one: Before you start, ensure the sourdough starter is very bubbly (if it's not, feed it and wait until 1 tsp of the starter floats in warm water). Tip 200g of the starter into a large bowl with all but 2 tbsp of the egg, the milk, flour, sugar, cinnamon, mixed spice, orange zest and raisins. Mix with your hands until you have a shaggy dough (all the flour should be mixed in). Or, do this in a stand mixer fitted with a dough hook. Cover with a clean, damp tea towel and leave to prove for 30 mins. Cover the rest of the sourdough starter and keep it chilled.

Step two: Work the butter and 1tsp salt into the dough by squashing it in using your hands. Once fully combined, tip the dough onto a surface and knead gently for 5 mins until smooth and springy (again, this can be done in a stand mixer fitted with a dough hook). Form the dough into a ball, then return it to the bowl. Cover and leave somewhere slightly warm for 3-4 hrs to prove until the dough has almost doubled in size.

Step three: Tip the dough onto a floured work surface and knead briefly, then divide into 12 pieces, about 100g each. Roll the pieces into balls and arrange on a baking tray lined with baking parchment, leaving some room between each. Cover with a clean, damp tea towel, then leave to prove again for 2-3 hrs at room temperature until doubled in size, or chill overnight (this will result in better flavour and a neater shape).

Step four: If the buns have been chilled, remove from the fridge 1 hr before baking. Heat the oven to $200^{\circ}\text{C}/180^{\circ}\text{C}$ fan/Gas 6. Brush the buns with the reserved egg. Tip the remaining starter into a piping bag fitted with a small nozzle, and pipe crosses onto the buns. Bake for 20-25 mins until light brown.



For the cakes: For the butter icing: 100g margarine 50g butter, softened 100g caster sugar 100g sieved icing sugar

2 medium eggs 100g self-raising flour Pre heat the oven to 190°C.

Please ask an adult to help you when you are using the oven.

Have ready 12 paper cases in a bun tray.

Make the cakes

P75

Cream the margarine and sugar together until light and fluffy.

Beat in the eggs one at a time, adding a little flour with each.

Gently fold in the remaining flour.

Half fill the paper cases with the mixture & bake for about 15 mins until firm.

Make the butter icing

Cream the butter, then gradually add the icing sugar and cream together.

When the cakes are cold, cut a slice from the top of each one and cut this slice in half to make the wings.

Place a little butter icing onto each cake & stick the wings into the it. Dust with icing sugar to decorate.
