

SHEEP CLASSES – EXHIBITOR NOTES & TROPHY ALLOCATIONS

EXHIBITORS IN THIS SECTION PLEASE NOTE:

- 1 Please ensure you have read the Society General Rules, Privacy and Health & Safety Statements on the website.
- 2 Entries online are preferred via the website www.weetonshow.co.uk. Entry forms can also be downloaded to be sent to the Sheep Secretary: Christine Morphet, 68 Church Close, Pool in Wharfedale, Leeds, LS21 1LW. Enquiries to sheep@weetonshow.co.uk.
- 3 **Closing date for entries 14 July 2024.** Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Sheep Secretary subject to a penalty of £1.00 per class.
- 4 No entries accepted on the day.
- 5 Entries of £10.00 will entitle the exhibitor to one exhibitor tickets. Tickets will be emailed. Additional tickets can be bought via the website.
- 6 **Judging** will start promptly at **9.15 am**.
- 7 **Penning** - All sheep must be penned before **8.45am** and remain there until 3.00pm unless adverse weather conditions require them to be moved for welfare. Late arrivals will only be accepted at the discretion of the secretary.
- 8 Sheep exhibited at this show must not be freshly dipped and be wet with dip. In preparing sheep for exhibition they must not be treated with a spray containing undiluted or very strong OP dip. Any product used at the show for treating sheep fleece should be marketed as suitable for this purpose and the appropriate precautions followed. Failure to comply will result in prize money being forfeited.
- 9 It is the exhibitor's responsibility to complete **TWO MOVEMENT FORMS** and hand them to the Licence Steward on the show day.
- 10 Separate unloading/loading and penning arrangements have been made for sheep for MV accredited flocks. To use these facilities sheep must be accompanied by a valid certificate of status (MUST BE STATED on entry form). **To be handed in before unloading of stock.**
- 11 Exhibitors are reminded that it is their responsibility to insure against damage caused by their animals.
- 12 If there are fewer than 3 entries in a class, the class may be combined with another where possible at the discretion of the sheep Secretary.
- 13 Young Handler and Junior Handler - Classes ages may be amended dependent on number of exhibitors. Age must be put on entry form. To be judged on presentation and turnout of stock and handler. All stock must halter trained. All exhibitors will receive a rosette.

TROPHY ALLOCATIONS

YOUNG HANDLER: A trophy kindly presented by Mr L Grange will be presented to the best pair overall in class S4.

TEXEL: Texel Trophy kindly donated by Mr Ian Clough will be awarded annually for the best entry in Classes S9-S14.

ANY OTHER PURE NATIVE BREED: The best sheep in section F will be awarded the Gray Builders Trophy kindly donated by Mr and Mrs Gray.

CROSS BREEDS: The Redhill Challenge Trophy. Kindly presented to the Society for annual competition by JW Roe, chosen from entries in Classes S25-S28.

SUPREME CHAMPIONSHIP: The D Bywater Memorial trophy kindly presented to the Society will be awarded annually to the overall champion in show.
